A migrant student (ages 3-21) has not graduated from high school and has moved, either alone, or with a parent, guardian, or spouse, who is a migrant agricultural worker.

Under Title I, Part C, Migrant Education is a United States Department of Education program that provides supplemental educational and support services to eligible migrant children.

The South Dakota Migrant Education Program supports educators serving migrant students with access to educational resources through the Midwest Migrant Education Resource Center.
